We want to learn together and keep this creative process alive.

And we need you to help us to transform our curiosity into the infrastructure, that enables us to participate in forming the future of Liébana together. We are sure this is possible, and we are convinced, that there will be a big resonance from our generation.

You have the power to make this a reality. Together, we can build a future that inspires young people to stay, contribute and dream here.
